Percent of Participation	95% (1,179÷1,233= .95)	58% (743÷1,279= .58)	79% (1,227÷1,547=.79)

“Fiscal” Eligibility – as defined by the required amount of funds to be set aside divided by the per pupil allocation. This determines the number of students that may be served.

Example: $\$500,000 \div \$1,200$ (per pupil amount) = 416 fiscally eligible students

“Criteria Eligibility - “Provision 2” and “Provision 3” of the National School Lunch Program allow schools that offer students lunches at no charge, regardless of the students’ economic status, to certify students as eligible for free or reduced price lunches. All students attending Provision 2 schools are deemed eligible to apply for SES.

If the demand for SES exceeds the fiscal eligibility the District will prioritize by offering services to the lowest-income, lowest-achieving students first.

Percent of Participation	7% (14÷198= .070)	.03% (16÷4,553= .003)	2% (24÷910= .02)

“Fiscal” Eligibility – as defined by the required amount of funds to be set aside divided by the cost of transportation. This determines the number of students that may be served.

Example: \$15,000 ÷ \$120 (round trip fare) = 125 fiscally eligible students

“Criteria Eligibility - Any student attending a Program Improvement school is deemed eligible for School Choice.

If the demand for School Choice exceeds the fiscal eligibility the District will prioritize by offering services to the lowest-income, lowest-achieving students first.
