Orff Schulwerk is an arts-infused approach that gets children speaking, singing, clapping, stomping, improvising, playing instruments and dancing. The Schulwerk is meant to be child-centered, total physical response activity modeled by the teacher and refined in cooperative learning groups. The master Orff teacher takes you on a joyful ride exploring sound and language, easily connecting with California State Standards in language arts, ELD, social studies and physical education.
