



## **FONTANA SCHOOL POLICE MILITARY EQUIPMENT ANNUAL REPORT – 2022**

### **1. UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM (UAS): AN UNMANNED AIRCRAFT ALONG WITH ASSOCIATED EQUIPMENT NECESSARY TO CONTROL IT REMOTELY:**

#### **(CATEGORY 1)**

- a. Description, Quantity, Capabilities, and Cost of Current UAS:** DJI MAVIC 2, COST: \$800 each, quantity 1
- b. Purpose:** To be deployed when its view would assist officers or incident commanders with the following situations, which include but are not limited to:
  - 1. Search for missing persons
  - 2. Natural disaster management
  - 3. Crime scene photography
  - 4. Tactical or other public safety and life preservation missions
  - 5. In response to specific requests from local, state or federal fire authorities for fire response and/or prevention
- c. Authorized Use:** Only assigned operators who have completed the required training shall be permitted to operate the DJI Mavic 2 PRO during approved missions.
- d. Expected Life Span:** 1-5 years all equipment
- e. Fiscal Impact:** None.
- f. Training:** Each operator must attend a 40-hour department training and ongoing quarterly training.
- g. Legal and Procedural Rules:** The Fontana School Police Department will utilize UAS only for official law enforcement purposes and in a manner that respects the privacy of our community, pursuant to State and Federal law.

## 2. COMMAND AND CONTROL VEHICLES

### (CATEGORY 5)

- a. **Description, Quantity, Capabilities, and Purchase Cost:** One (1) Model Year 2020 Ford Explorer, Supervisor's Vehicle; Cost: \$42,000. The Ford Explorer is a mobile command post and an equipment storage unit; Computer MDC to track operations; store equipment for critical incidents. (Pick, Ram, Shield, Riot Shields, Pepper Ball Rounds)
- b. **Purpose:** To be used based on the specific circumstances of a given critical incident, large event, natural disaster or display at a community event that is taking place.
- c. **Authorized Use:** Supervisor command post shall be used by Supervisors deployment and in a manner consistent with Department policy and training.
- d. **Expected Life Span:** 5 Years.
- e. **Fiscal Impact:** Annual maintenance cost estimated between \$0 and \$1,000 annually.

## 3. BATTERING RAMS

### (CATEGORY 7)

- a. **Description, Quantity, Capabilities, and Purchase Cost:** Blackhawk! Dynamic Entry Mono-Shock Rams (3); Cost: \$1,056
- b. **Purpose:** To safely and quickly gain entry into a structure.
- c. **Authorized Use:** Situations for use include to enter a structure to save a life or apprehending a suspect.
- d. **Expected Life Span:** No explanation.
- e. **Fiscal Impact:** None.

#### 4. SPECIALIZED FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION

##### (CATEGORY 9)

- a. Quantity, Description, Capabilities, and Purchase Cost:** 18 Colt Carbine Rifle LEG920 firearms; capable of accurately stopping an armed subject at various distances. The Colt Carbine Rifle is a lightweight, air-cooled, gas-operated, magazine fed, shoulder fired weapon, designed for semi-automatic fire. The Carbine Rifle does not have an expiration and will need to be serviced or replaced when the rifle fails or breaks. **Cost:** The purchase of the rifles was a \$18,000 in 2013.
- I. (16) Colt LE 6920 .223 Patrol
  - II. (2) Colt LE 6946 M4COMM .223 Traffic
- b. Purpose:** To be used as precision weapons to address a threat with more precision and/or at greater distances than a handgun, if present and feasible within Department Policy and Applicable Law.
- c. Authorized Use:** Only members that are POST certified Peace Officers and have completed the POST Firearms/Tactical Rifle Course.
- d. Expected Lifespan:** No Expiration.
- e. Fiscal Impact:**
- I. Carbine Rifle – Annual cost \$0
  - II. 5.56mm 55gr. Full Metal Jacket – Annual cost between \$0 - \$1,919 for all rifles combined, duty ammunition.
- f. Training:** Prior to using a rifle, officers must be certified by POST instructors in the operation of the rifle. Additionally, all members that operate any rifle are required to pass a range qualification four times a year.
- g. Legal and Procedural Rules:** Use is established under Policy 413 of the Fontana School Police Department. It is the policy of the Fontana School Police Department to utilize rifles only for official law enforcement purposes, and pursuant to State and Federal law regarding the use of force.

5. **LESS LETHAL PEPPER BALL LAUNCHER: USED TO DEPLOY THE LESS LETHAL PEPPER BALL ROUND**

(CATEGORY 12 & CATEGORY 14)

a. **Description, quantity, capabilities, and purchase cost:**

**LAUNCHER** - Cost: \$7,500; Quantity: 15

This launcher is used to deploy the Less Lethal Round up to a distance of 75 feet. The range of the weapon system helps to maintain space between officers and a suspect reducing the immediacy of the threat which is a principle of De-escalation.

**PEPPER BALL ROUND** – Cost \$2,475; Quantity: 750 rounds

A less lethal round firing a velocity of 350 feet per second (FPS). These rounds are discharged from a dedicated Launcher that is distinguishable by an air tank and fore grip. This round provides accurate and effective performance when fired from the approved distance of not fewer than fifteen (15) feet. Effectiveness depends on many variables, such as distance, clothing, stature, and the point where the projectile impacts.

- b. **Purpose:** To limit the escalation of conflict where employment of lethal force is prohibited or undesirable.
- c. **Authorized Use:** Self-destructive, dangerous and/or combative individuals, riot/crowd control and civil unrest incidents, circumstances where a tactical advantage can be obtained, potentially vicious animals, and training exercises or approved demonstrations.
- d. **Life Span:** No expiration.
- e. **Fiscal Impact:** None.
- f. **Training:** All Officers are trained in the Pepper Ball Launcher as a less lethal option by in-service training.
- g. **Legal and Procedural Rules:** It is the policy of the Fontana School Police Department to utilize the less lethal launcher only for official law enforcement purposes, and pursuant to State and Federal law, including those regarding the use of force.

6. **TASER DEVICES AND CARTRIDGES**

(CATEGORY 13)

a. **Description, Quantity, Capabilities, and Purchase Cost:**

(20) Tasers X26P Devices - \$5,600

(31) Duty Cartridges - \$1,748.00

(49) Duty Cartridges (Supplies)

(24) Batteries – XPPM, Spare Cartridge Battery Pack, X26P - \$1,919

b. **Purpose:** Assist officers with controlling and apprehending a violent and physically resisting subject.

c. **Authorized Use:** A subject is violent or is physically resisting in a violent manner; minimize injury to officers and subject.

d. **Expected Life Span:** 1-5 years

e. **Fiscal Impact:** Annual Fiscal Impact (Re-Certification required)
