Draw a picture about an event in the story.</p>	<p>Collect 5 objects. Use your five frame to make different numbers.</p>
<p>Measure each person in your family. Draw them from tallest to shortest.</p>	<p>Make a card for a family member. Draw a picture on the cover and write letters inside. Parents: Ask your child what they want to say to the person and write it inside the card.</p>	<p>Count how many windows and doors are in your home. Which one has more? Which one has less?</p>	<p>Talk to your family about your favorite books. Read one book. Parents: Ask questions about the characters and events in the story as you read.</p>
<p>Fill a plate with salt (or dirt) to draw shapes, letters, or numbers with your finger.</p>	<p>Play dominoes with your family.</p>	<p>Make solid shapes with playdough. Cylinder, rectangular prism, sphere.</p>	<p>Count as high as you can. Can you count to 10? 20? 30? 40? 50? 100?</p>
<p>Find 5 shapes in your home. Draw a picture of them.</p>	<p>Write your letters on the sidewalk with chalk. Have an adult take a picture of you by your letters.</p>	<p>Use playdough to make letters or numbers.</p>	<p>Help your family sort the socks to make pairs.</p>
