Aging Facilities in Need of Repair

FUSD has been serving the community and providing high-quality education to local students for over 65 years, but many of our facilities are aging and in need of repair. Outdated security and safety features, including aging electrical and fire safety systems, as well as portable classrooms with only one or two electrical outlets and limited high-speed internet access are inadequate for today's learning environment.



To keep pace with academic standards and improve student safety and security, Fontana Unified School District is considering placing a bond measure on the November 2022 ballot. The measure could generate up to \$349 million for school facilities projects and cost property owners within the district approximately \$60 per \$100,000 of assessed (not market) value while bonds are outstanding.

If approved, bond funds could be used to:

- Repair leaky roofs and remove asbestos, lead paint and mold
- Keep schools safe and secure
- Provide early childhood classrooms for all children under 4 years old at every school site by 2025
- Prevent overcrowding by providing additional schools and classrooms
- Help prepare our students for 21st-century jobs and careers
- Build science, technology, engineering and math labs

Strict Fiscal Accountability and Transparency

A potential locally controlled bond measure would include strict fiscal accountability protections, including:

- No money from a bond measure would go towards administrators' salaries or pensions
- All money raised by a measure would stay local to support our students and could not be taken away by the State
- A Citizens' Oversight Committee and independent audits would be required
