SUBJECT	REQUIREMENTS	CREDITS
English	Eight semesters in grades 9-12	40
Mathematics	Four semesters in grades 9-12 (including at least one full year of IM1 and IM2)	20
Physical Education	Two semesters in grade 9. Two additional semesters grades 10-12.	20
Science	Four semesters grade 9-12. Two semesters each in Physical and Life Science.	20
Visual & Performing Arts/Foreign Language	Two semesters of courses from any of these fields in grades 9-12	10
Social Studies	World History grade 10; U.S. History 11th, Government/Economics 12th	30

Graduation is based upon the successful completion of 230 semester units of credit in grades 9 - 12. Five credits are earned for each subject passed each semester. Credits above those required by the Fontana Unified School District will be considered electives.

As part of the 230 credit requirement, certain required subjects must be completed. These are specified by the California Education Code, the California Administrative Code, and the policy decisions of the Fontana Unified School District Board of Education. All classes must be passed (D or higher) in order to receive credit. Any failed required course must be repeated until passed to receive credit.

A-G COLLEGE REQUIREMENT



The A - G College Entrance Requirements are a sequence of high school courses that students **MUST** complete WITH A GRADE OF “C” or BETTER to be minimally eligible for admission to the University of California (UC) and/or California State University (CSU) systems. They represent the most basic level of academic preparation that high school students should achieve to undertake university work. Students should note that college admission is extremely competitive and doing more than the minimum is advised.

The following chart summarizes the A-G College Entrance Requirements:

AREA	SUBJECT	REQUIRED	RECOMMENDED	DETAILS
A	History/Social Studies	2	2	Two years, including one year of world history, cultures, and historical geography and one year of US history or one-half year of US history and one-half year of civics or American government.
B	English	4	4	Four years of college preparatory English that include frequent and regular writing, and reading of classic and modern literature.
C	Mathematics	3	4	Three years of college preparatory mathematics that include the topics covered in elementary and advanced algebra and two- and three-dimensional geometry.
D	Laboratory Science	2	3	Two years of laboratory science providing fundamental knowledge in at least two of these disciplines: biology, chemistry, and physics. (Earth Science does NOT count.)
E	Language other than English	2	3	Two years of the same language other than English.
F	Visual & Performing Arts	1	1	One year, including dance, drama/theater, music, or visual art.
G	College Prep Elective	1	1	One year (two semesters), chosen from additional “A-F” courses beyond those used to satisfy the requirement above, or courses that have been approved solely for use as “G” electives.

Additional Information on A-G/College Entrance Requirements

The purposes of the A-G College Entrance Requirements are to ensure that entering students:

- Can participate fully in the first year program at a UC and/or a CSU in a broad variety of fields of study
- Have attained the necessary preparation for courses, majors, and programs offered at a UC and/or a CSU
- Have attained a body of knowledge that will provide breadth and perspective to new, more advanced studies
- Have attained essential critical thinking and study skills
