We hope this letter finds you healthy and safe. As anticipated, in response to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, College Board has changed Advance Placement (AP) testing administration this year. College Board is focused on assisting students with completing the exams. In efforts to keep students and parents informed, FUSD is providing you with some pertinent AP information.

AP online exams will begin Monday, May 11th, 2020. Please refer to the chart to determine your designated testing times. College Board has strict timeframes for this online administration, so it is very important that you review the exam schedule and take the necessary steps to prepare for your exam(s).

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Exam Directions and Exam Security

College Board has taken necessary steps to protect the integrity of each exam administration. This year's exam will be open book/open note. However, students may not consult with any other individuals during the testing period (with the exception of students working on the AP Computer Science Principles Create Performance Task).

- The exam format and questions are being designed specifically for an **at-home administration**, so points will not be earned from content that can be found in textbooks or online.
- Each subject's exam will be taken on the same day at the same time.
- On test day, students will be required to verify their identity and confirm the work they submitted is their own.
- College Board has set up tools to detect plagiarism so follow good scholarly habits and academic integrity.

FAQs

Q: Have AP exams been cancelled for the 2019-2020 school year?

A: No, AP exams will be given in a modified, online format May 11, 2020, through May 22, 2020, with a late testing window date of June 1, 2020, through June 5, 2020. Please refer to the exam schedule included with this mailer for subject specific exam dates and times.

Q: If I was signed up for late testing previously, will I do late online testing as well?

A: No. If you were previously assigned to late testing, this was to ensure adequate time to take two, potentially overlapping exams. This is not a factor with the modified, online testing. Late online testing should only be used in the event of technical difficulties such as power or internet outages. If you intend to take your exam during late testing, you MUST contact your site AP Coordinator for approval.

Q: If I choose to cancel my AP exam, will I be charged the \$40 cancellation fee?

A: While cancelling your exam is discouraged, you will not be charged cancellation fees should you decide to cancel.

Q: How will I take the exam online if I don't have a device and/or internet service?

A: Please use the contact information in this mailer to notify your site AP Coordinator of your needs immediately. Please remember AP exams may be taken on tablets, laptops, PCs, or even cell phones. The school sites, in conjunction with the District Office, are working to ensure students receive laptops who need them. Further, College Board is assisting with providing access to resources needed to successfully test. Please contact them directly at cb.org/tech by April 24, 2020.

Q: Will colleges and universities still award credit for 2020 AP exams?

A: The UC system has stated it will award credit for the 2020 exams consistent with previous years for students who score a 3, 4, or 5 on their AP exams. While not all colleges and universities have weighed in, many institutions, including Yale University, has gone on record as saying they will award credit in line with the UC system's policy.

Q: Can I use multiple devices to complete my AP exam(s)?

A: Yes and No. You MUST use the same device to upload/submit your responses that you used to log in and retrieve your exam(s). You could, however, use one device such as a laptop to log in and receive your secured exam tasks, hand write your responses, take a photo of your work from your cell phone to upload, and then email it to your laptop/upload it to your laptop for submission.

Q: What is the format of the AP exam(s) this year?

A: While all exams have been shortened, and no exam will have multiple choice questions, the format of the AP exams will vary from subject to subject. Q: What if I need accommodations such as extra time during testing?

A: Use the contact information provided in this mailer to notify your site AP Coordinator immediately. He/she will be able to inform you whether you have approved accommodations through College Board and what those are. If you have an active IEP or 504 plan, your site AP Coordinator may still apply for accommodations for testing. Any approved accommodations (i.e. extra time during testing) will be applied to the online timer once you log in and begin your exam.

Q: When will I receive my exam scores?

A: Teachers will receive copies of student responses no later than May 26, 2020; however, scores will not be released until July as per usual CB/AP procedure.
