The County Office of Education's approval of the District's adopted 2009/10 budget is based on the commitment of the District's Board of Education to implement ongoing expenditure reductions sufficient to implement the state's recently enacted budget and meet state reserves in all years. As a part of the *conditional approval*, the District must have the Board of Education approve revised current and multiyear financial projections for 2009/10 through 2011/12 which identify either an additional board resolution identifying the board's commitment to implement a specified dollar amount of reductions that allow the district to meet the minimum state reserves in all years or a specific action plan of the District. The plan must incorporate the reductions identified in the recently enacted state budget and final 2008/09 ending balances.

The Department of Fiscal services is working on the necessary budget reductions based on the State's adopted budget and the District's ending, unaudited balances. This necessary budget information will be sent to the Board of Education under separate cover before the Board meeting.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Contract Code Section 12110, the Department of General Services is authorized to make purchases or leases of electronic data processing or telecommunications goods and services on behalf of school districts and other local governmental agencies; and

WHEREAS, the purchases or leases of such goods and services by the Department of General Services are to be made upon the same terms, conditions and specifications at a price lower than the District can obtain through its normal acquisition procedures; and

WHEREAS, the California Multiple Award Schedules (CMAS) has contracts for electronic data processing or telecommunications goods and services which the District needs to purchase in order to complete the project identified below; and

WHEREAS, based upon the facts identified below and information presented to the Governing Board, it is in the best interest of the District to purchase the electronic data processing goods and services from Network Integration Company Partners, Inc. d.b.a. NIC Partners, who currently has contracts in good standing with CMAS. This authorization is requested for the 2009/2010 school year through June 30, 2010.

SECTION 1. FACTS SUPPORTING PURCHASE OFF CMAS:

Network Integration Company Partners, Inc. d.b.a. NIC Partners has provided network wiring, network services, telephony solutions, telecommunications equipment for surrounding districts for over seven years. They have provided Fontana Unified School District and area districts with an excellent product and are aware of our District's standards and needs.

Based upon the goods and services to be provided by Network Integration Company Partners, Inc. d.b.a. NIC Partners, it has been determined that the price to be obtained through CMAS is lower than if the District were to competitively bid the goods and services.

SECTION 2. FINDINGS: The Governing Board, upon consideration of the facts identified in Section 1 above, and upon the information, data, etc., provided at the meeting at which this Resolution is adopted, hereby finds that it is in the best interest of the District to utilize Network Integration Company Partners, Inc. d.b.a. NIC Partners CMAS Contract Numbers 3-07-58-0235A, 3-07-70-2473C, 3-08-70-2473F, 3-09-70-2473G, 3-09-00-2473A and 3-09-70-2473A for electronic data processing goods and services needed through June 30, 2010.

SECTION 3. PAYMENT BOND: In accordance with the requirements of Civil Code Section 3247, Network Integration Company Partners, Inc. d.b.a. NIC Partners will provide a payment bond for 100% of each contract amount.

BACKGROUND:

The District entered into an amended contract in 1997 with California Financial Services to provide specialized economic financial planning and advisory services for State Financial Hardship and State matching funding. Before the contract expired the District entered into an "Extended Agreement" that replaced the previous agreement and extended the term from 2002 to 2004. In 2003, the District once again entered into another "Extended Agreement" which replaced the 2002 to 2004 version and changed the term to run from 2003 to 2008. No documentation has been located as to whether the 1997 agreement or any predecessor agreements were or were not approved by the Board. No Board approval documentation has been located for the successor replacement agreements.

The compensation under the 2003-2008 contract was based on a percentage of State funding obtained. At the time the 2003-2008 contract was entered into, the amount of the potential State funding was unknown. One of the most recent projects for which State Financial Hardship funding was obtained was the modernization project at Cypress Elementary School. Total State funding obtained for this project was \$4,046,920.00. California Financial Services is due compensation for the Cypress modernization project which was completed April 3, 2009, in the amount of \$40,469.20. The County is now requiring Board approval of the 2003-2008 agreement in accordance with current Board Policy so payment can be made.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education ratify the extended agreement for specialized economic financial planning and advisory services for State Financial Hardship and State matching funding with California Financial Services, dated July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2008, and approve payments per the terms of the contract, and specifically approve the payment for services for Cypress Elementary School modernization in the amount of \$40,469.20.

BACKGROUND:

Action Learning Systems provides customized assessments that measure student progress in mastering the California content standards and are calibrated to the rigor of the California Standards Tests (CST) and the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE). These Benchmark Assessments will be used in Mathematics and English Language-Arts grades K-11. As mentioned in the Local Educational Agency Addendum, data from these exams will help teachers, counselors, and administrators make informed decisions regarding instructional practices and academic interventions.

FISCAL IMPLICATION:

This price per benchmark is derived from actual student use and will vary each year based on student enrollment. By entering into a three-year agreement with Action Learning Systems, the District will secure the lowest possible unit price of \$.65 per student, per assessment. Original agreement was board approved on 5/7/08.

General Funds – not to exceed \$108,927.00 for the 2009-2010 school year.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education approve entering into a contract with Action Learning Systems to provide District Benchmark Assessments in Mathematics and English-Language Arts K-11, not to exceed \$108,927.00 for the 2009-2010 school year effective July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010.

CHECKING ACCOUNT PROCEDURES

1.0 Annually

- 1.1 A reservation in the amount of \$50,000.00 for the Adult Education Fund checking account shall be established in the fund balance of the Adult Education Fund at the beginning of each fiscal year.
- 1.2 Board of Education approval of the new fiscal year budgets containing the reservation for the Adult Education Fund checking account shall constitute annually establishment of the checking account and the checking account amount.

2.0 Internal Controls

- 2.1 Expenditures from the checking account shall include:
 - a) Refunds for Adult Education student fees and books originally paid with cash
 - b) Bowling fees for the Adult Education, Special Education Class
- 2.2 The Director of Fiscal Services will make all necessary changes to the checking account
- 2.3 Payments
 - 2.3.1 A payment approval voucher must be signed by the Director of Career Technical Education or Coordinator of Adult Education prior to any checks being written.
 - 2.3.2 Original receipts and other documentation substantiating the payment must be turned into the Director of Career Technical Education, Coordinator of Adult Education, or designee within two working days of purchase. Documentation is to be attached to the payment approval voucher and submitted monthly to the Accounts Payable Supervisor as back-up for account reconciliation.
- 2.4 The form and type of check used for the checking account shall be approved by the Deputy Superintendent, Business Services.
- 2.5 The checking account and all procedures used in conjunction with the checking account shall be audited by the Districts external auditor and reported in the Districts annual audit report.

- 2.6 The Director of Career Technical Education will have the overall responsibility for the checking account and the required procedures and internal controls.
- 2.7 Checks written on the checking account will require two signatures
 - 2.7.1 The signatories for the checks include any combination of Deputy Superintendent, Business Services; Director of Career Technical Education and Director of Fiscal Services.
- 2.8 The individual within the Adult Education office that processes checks for payment shall not be the individual who receives funds. Incoming funds will be deposited by the Accounting Department
- 2.9 Monthly, the Accounts Payable Supervisor will reconcile the account with the bank statement and provide necessary information to the district external auditors as requested.
- 2.10 Monthly, a transfer shall be made from the bank account to the San Bernardino County Treasurer for deposit into the Adult Education Fund student fees revenue account.
