Ms. Chavez expressed that it had been a very stressful and emotional time for her, that the City was suffering a deep cut and it was time to stitch up and heal, and that discrimination of any kind would not be accepted. She commented that there were issues in need of being taken care of; the lack of the Mayor to recognize there was a gang and a dropout problem, and her belief that she could make a difference in the Board and community to address problems.

Mrs. Ramos noted that her husband and children were Hispanic and believed that Mrs. Binks did not have a racist bone in her body; that she truly did not understand the comment made and that her apologies were sincere.

Mrs. Mancha expressed her admiration of Mrs. Binks, and asked about the enrollment process for secondary students. Mrs. Olsen-Binks provided that was part of the Secondary Initiative and offered to bring information back to the Board.

Mrs. Binks congratulated the Academic Decathlon students, commented on a Regional Occupational Programs meeting she had attended, congratulated Ms. Chavez' daughter, thanked those who had provided their support and noted that if she thought her apology would not have been accepted or thought sincere she would not have offered it.

Mr. Hawthorn asked Mrs. Binks to bring information on the organization being formed to the entire Board, expressed concern about the track at Fontana High School, and commented on the Career Technical Education and PTA Council meetings he had attended.

Mrs. Olsen-Binks noted that the seniority list for Classified employees that Mr. Williams had asked about was more complicated than the one for Certificated and that staff wanted to be sure all of the information would be correct, that other than observing Spirit Fridays during football season Administration should not dress down on Fridays to make sure they looked professional, and that she was looking at ways other districts handled liquidation of obsolete items. She shared information on a Mother's Day Essay / Artistic Expression Contest being sponsored by the Inland Empire Do Peace and Nonviolence Alliance, recognized a Kitchen Assistant at Summit High School as one of the Classified Employees of the Year selected by San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools, and commented on the process to remedy Fontana A. B. Miller High School's placement on the State's list of persistently low achieving schools.

Fontana A. B. Miller High school has been identified as a Persistently Low Achieving School by the State of California in accordance with the following Federal guideline: the Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) proficiency average for last 3 years at A. B. Miller High School is - 36.45%.

The District must adopt one of four models for school improvement:

- Turnaround: remove Principal and Staff, rehire no more than 50% of original staff, adopt a new governance structure, implement a research-based instructional program aligned to the State Standards, increase learning time
- Restart: school is closed and reopens as a charter school, operated by an approved State Charter Operator
- School Closure: school is closed and students enroll in a higher achieving FUSD school
- Transformation: remove Principal, improve teacher and school leader effectiveness, increase learning time, institute instructional reform, create a community- oriented school, provide operational flexibility

Any person 18 years of age or over is eligible to enroll in Adult Education classes regardless of residence. Certain eligible minors may also enroll.

BP 6158

Instruction

The Governing Board authorizes independent study as an optional alternative instructional strategy by which students in grades K-12 and adult education may reach curriculum objectives and fulfill graduation requirements. Independent study shall offer a means of individualizing the educational plan for students whose needs may be met best through study outside of the regular classroom setting.

(cf. 5147 - Dropout Prevention)

The district's independent study option shall be substantially equivalent in quality and quantity to classroom instruction, thus enabling students enrolled in independent study to complete the district's adopted course of study within the customary time frame. Students in independent study shall have access to the same services and resources as is available to other students in the school.

(cf. 6143 - Courses of Study)

(cf. 6200 - Adult Education)

In accordance with state law, independent study, a learning strategy, shall be established to meet unique educational needs of students at the elementary and secondary levels which cannot be appropriately accommodated in the regular instructional program. (Education Code 51745)

A student may be enrolled in a program of independent study with the mutual agreement of the district, parent/guardian if a student is a minor and the student. Independent study may be a part of the student's regular educational program, or may be a student's only educational program, concurrent enrollment, or may be a student's only educational program. An independent study program may be established to complete days of attendance missed due to vacations or other emergencies. Maximum assignment times, assignments, and methods of evaluation shall be four weeks K-12 ~~and adult school~~.

The primary goal of independent study is to offer a means of establishing an individual educational program for students whose needs may best be met through study outside of the regular classroom instructional setting.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that each participating student has independent

study agreements and contracts with the district as prescribed by law. Individual course contracts for independent study must be consistent with the district's adopted course of study.

Students requesting independent study and their parents/guardians should recognize that independent study at the elementary level must emphasize a commitment on the part of the student's parents/guardians. At the secondary level, the major commitment must be made on the part of the student.

The Superintendent or designee shall establish appropriate screening procedures to ensure that the necessary level of commitment exists to meet the conditions of the independent study contract prior to executing an agreement.

When any student misses three independent study assignments, the Superintendent or designee shall conduct an evaluation to determine whether it is in the student's best interest to remain in independent study.

The Superintendent or designee shall establish regulations to implement this policy and shall provide an annual report to the Board regarding the number of students in independent study programs, the ADA generated, the quality of student work and the general success of the programs.

The Board believes that independent study is a key component of efforts to retain students who are at risk of dropping out of school and to retrieve students who have already dropped out.

No student or teacher shall be required to participate in independent study. (Education Code 51747)

No course required for high school graduation shall be offered exclusively through independent study. (Education Code 51745)

BACKGROUND:

The Fontana Unified School District proposes to construct Elementary School No. 29 located at Merrill and Alder Avenues. Pursuant to California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requirements, a Preliminary Environmental Assessment (PEA) has been prepared. The results of the PEA are documented in the PEA Report dated January 19, 2010. The PEA Report concluded that there are organochlorine pesticides (OCPs) present in Site soil at concentrations exceeding Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) Soil Screening Levels. The PEA recommended Removal Actions for onsite soil impacted by OCPs at concentrations exceeding DTSC Soil Screening Levels. The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) has provided review comments to the draft PEA Report in a letter dated March 17, 2010. As part of the CEQA requirements, a public hearing must be held regarding the PEA Report and the report must be available for a public review period of 30 days.

Notice of availability of this document was published in the *San Bernardino County Sun newspaper* on March 29, 2010 with a 30-day public review from March 29, 2010 through April 29, 2010. The District Board of Education must hold a Public Hearing to comply with CEQA requirements.

BACKGROUND:

The District is planning on obtaining “Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design” (LEED) basic certification for proposed Elementary School No. 29 site located at Alder and Merrill Avenues. LEED is a certification program that scores projects on how much they minimize negative impacts and increase positive impacts according to the following factors: the site sustainability, water efficiency, energy/atmosphere, materials/resources, indoor environmental quality, and innovations in design. A LEED requirement is “commissioning.” The objective of commissioning is to provide documented confirmation that a facility is designed to meet District requirements, is built according to the planned design, and is able to operate as designed. Commissioning usually looks at key building systems, such as heating and air-conditioning and energy management controls, lighting and controls, water heating, and the building envelope. An independent “commissioning agent” is hired to review plans and documents, validate required testing and adjustments done by the construction contractors, provide deficiency reports so corrections can be made, and provide a final report that systems do operate as intended.

The project architect, on behalf of the District, solicited proposals from two qualified commissioning service agencies. After review of the two proposals, the District and architect concur that Glumac will provide the best value to the District on this project for a fee of \$83,000.00, plus a contingency of \$5,000.00, plus reimbursables.

FISCAL IMPLICATION:

RECOMMENDATION:

BACKGROUND:

Board Policy 3312 requires a public hearing before the District can enter into any exclusive or nonexclusive advertising or sale of carbonated beverages or non-nutritious beverages.

Beverage vending machines are used throughout the District. No carbonated beverages are stocked in vending machines available for student use. Student vending machines contain Water and/or Gatorade/Powerade. All beverages provided for student consumption are in compliance with Board Policy 5030 Student Wellness Policy.

Request for proposals was sent out for beverage vending machine services throughout the District. Proposals were received from Coca-Cola Bottling Company and Pepsi Bottling Group.

Coca-Cola's proposal is the most advantageous to the District.

Coca-Cola Bottling Company offers:

1. 25% commission on all sales.
2. Sponsorship fee of \$1,650.00 per high school for years 1, 2 & 3; \$2,500.00 for years 4 & 5.
3. Annual free goods: donated beverages of 200 cases of 12 oz. cans or ½ liter Dasani water.

Pepsi Bottling Group offers:

1. 15% commission on all sales.

Nutritional value and fat, sugar and additives content of all beverages is attached.

The school meal program plans and prepares meals using the SHAPE Nutrient Standard approach in accordance with United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). These requirements ensure menus are designed to contribute to the Recommended Dietary Allowances based on the students age/grade level. Requirements include but are not limited minimum levels for Vitamin A, Vitamin C, and Iron with maximum levels for total fat and saturated fat.

Fresh Fruits, Vegetables and grains are available daily through the school meal program. Wherever possible the Food Services department looks to purchase locally grown organic produce for use in the school meal program, which recently included oranges and kiwifruit. Grains offered through the school meal program are creditable grain products as specified by the USDA. This means that products are prepared with enriched, fortified and/or whole grain products in order provide students with important nutrients, such as fiber, folate and iron.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education hold a public hearing and approve a 5-year contract, beginning July 1, 2010 with Coca-Cola Bottling Company of Southern California for beverage vending machine services throughout the District.

1. That due to a lack of funds and/or lack of work, the number of classified employees and the amount of service rendered shall be reduced by layoff as specified above, pursuant to Education Code section 45308.
2. That the Superintendent is directed to give notice of reduction/layoff to the affected classified employees pursuant to the requirements of law.
3. For classified personnel, that said reductions/layoffs shall become effective on July 1, 2010.
4. That employees reduced/laid off pursuant to this Resolution shall be eligible for reemployment pursuant to Education Code section 45298.
