BACKGROUND:

Each year school districts are required to publish School Accountability Report Cards (SARC) for each school site detailing information regarding student achievement, facilities, staffing, instructional programs, professional development, and class size. Prior to the 2011 publication, the California Department of Education provided Districts with data pulled directly from state and county reporting.

At its November 2010 meeting, the State Board of Education approved the 2010/11 School Accountability Report Card template and, at the same time, received a report from the California Department of Education that, due to budget and staffing reductions, the department would not be able to fill in some of the data that typically is provided to districts as they prepare their SARCs. This shift of responsibility for that data collection and reporting to each district (and school) now requires districts and school sites to take on additional duties with a short timeline. Because of the lateness in approving the template and the necessity for school districts to assume responsibility for manually gathering and inputting some of the data required for the 2010/11 SARC posting on February 1st we are requesting permission to submit a Request for Waiver.

The first reading of Fontana Unified School District Board Policy 5118, Transfers, Open Enrollment Transfers, was approved at the January 19, 2011 Board of Education meeting, and is now being brought back for second reading adoption.

New language is shown as underlined text in the attached.

Transfers

Students who apply for initial admission to district schools will be placed at the grade they would have reached elsewhere pending observation and evaluation by classroom teachers, guidance personnel and the principal or designee.

Evaluation and observation to determine final grade placement of each newly enrolled student should be completed within 30 days of enrollment. The principal or designee shall determine the student's final grade placement.

The district shall accept for credit any coursework satisfactorily completed by students while detained in a juvenile court school or county or state-operated institution. Students successfully completing graduation requirements of the district while being detained shall receive a diploma of graduation from the school last attended in the district.

Withdrawals

Students who are going to transfer or withdraw from school should bring a note from their parents/guardians indicating where they are moving, and, if possible, what school they plan to attend.

By the day of clearance, students should have returned all school books and materials. Students should be certain that no fines remain against them at time of withdrawal. Transcripts and grades may be withheld from students who do not return school property which they have been lent.

OPEN ENROLLMENT ACT TRANSFERS

The Governing Board desires to offer enrollment options in order to provide students with opportunities for academic achievement that meet their diverse needs. Such options shall also be provided to students who reside within another district's boundaries in accordance with law, Board policy, and administrative regulation.

Whenever a student is attending a district school on the Open Enrollment List as identified by the Superintendent of Public Instruction, he/she may transfer to another school within or outside of the district, as long as the school to which he/she is transferring has a higher Academic Performance Index. (Education Code 48354, 48356)

A parent/guardian whose student is attending a district school on the Open Enrollment List and who wishes to have his/her student attend another school within the district shall apply for enrollment using BP/AR 5116.1 - Intradistrict Open Enrollment. Transfer applications shall be submitted between January 1st and January 31st of the preceding school year for which the transfer is requested.

In order to ensure that priorities for enrollment in district schools are implemented in accordance with law, the Board hereby waives the January 1 deadline in Education Code 48354 for all applications for transfer from nonresident parents/guardians of children attending a school on the Open Enrollment List in another district. Transfer applications shall be submitted between March 1st and May 1st of the preceding school year for which the transfer is requested.

Standards for Rejection of Transfer Applications

Pursuant to Education Code 48356, the Board has adopted the following standards for acceptance and rejection of transfer applications submitted by a parent/guardian of a student attending a school in another district on the Open Enrollment List. The Superintendent or designee shall apply these standards in accordance with Board policy and administrative regulation and shall ensure that the standards are applied uniformly and consistently.

As applicable, the Superintendent or designee may deny a transfer application under any of the following circumstances:

1. Upon a determination that approval of the transfer application would negatively impact the capacity of a program, class, grade level, or school building, including:

- a. The class or grade level exceeding the district's limits pursuant to state class size reduction programs.
- b. The site, classroom, or program exceeding the maximum student-teacher ratio specified in the district's collective bargaining agreement.
- c. The site or classroom exceeding the physical capacity of the facility pursuant to the district's facilities master plan or other facility planning document.
- d. The class or grade level exceeding capacity pursuant items #a-#c above in subsequent years as the student advances to other grade levels at the school.

- 2. Upon a determination that approval of the transfer application would have an adverse financial impact on the district, including:
 - a. The hiring of additional certificated or classified staff
 - b. The operation of additional classrooms or instructional facilities
 - c. Expenses incurred by the district that would not be covered by the apportionment of funds received from the state resulting in a reduction of the resources available to resident students

The parent/guardian of a student who is denied a transfer shall be notified in writing, given specific reasons for the denial, and informed of the appeal process which might be pursued.

BACKGROUND:

Discovery Education, formerly known as United Streaming, has been one of the key technology services offered to teachers within our district over the past nine years. This online database of instructional videos, assignment builders, and online assessment is used daily in K-12 classrooms across our district. 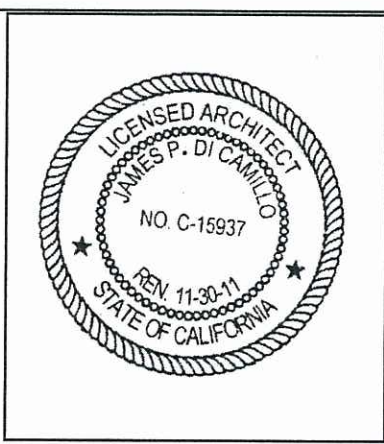

Fontana High School will be conducting their full visit WASC reviews February 28 – March 2, 2011. The WASC visiting team will incur expenses as a result of the WASC review and must be reimbursed to the individual reviewers per current WASC procedures. The visiting WASC team at each site consists of 8 reviewers.
