The Board of Education of the Fontana Unified School District held a Regular Meeting on October 1, 2003, at the John D. Piazza Education Center, 9680 Citrus Avenue, Fontana, California. The President opened a public hearing and called for comments from the audience regarding the following item:

There were no comments.

The President closed the public comment period.

The President adjourned the Public Hearing and called the Regular Meeting to order.

Regular Meeting

Mr. Dave Ackley, Director, Administrative Support and Student Events, introduced Mr. Clark Mahoney of Date Elementary. Mr. Mahoney presented the top readers who shared with the Board the number of books and words read during the past year. Dr. Bradley thanked all involved and provided certificates to the students.

Student Showcase

The President called the Hearing Session to order and called for comments from visitors.

Visitors' Comments

Mr. Tony Orlich spoke of television and commercials. Children do not learn by watching commercials. Thomas Jefferson quoted "the government cannot protect our liberties, only the people can protect our liberties". Government officials can be intimidating. The media does tell all; important articles are printed on the back which should be on the front page. Officials lie about installing democracy in Iraq. Patriotic Act did not help. There is a book on the wars in Iraq and Persian Gulf authored by William Rivers Pitt, with a co-author, on what the Bush team does not want you to know.

Mr. Alan Campbell, VFW Post representative, spoke about new program at post level to award three teachers. Spoke with Mr. Sam Poindexter, President of the FTA and explained program. VFW National Citizens recognizes top teachers. Submit nominations by November 1, 2003 to the FTA. There will be cash awards and plaques. Awards are available for one teacher from each of the following grade levels; K-5, 6-8 and 9-12. Awards include a cash prize of \$1,000.00 and an all expense-paid trip to Washington, D. C. Spoke with Mr. Sam Poindexter about judging the teachers as the post does not have the ability to judge teachers.

Ms. DeeDee Arganda, teacher at Harry S. Truman Middle School and the parent of a Fontana High School student, shared her concerns about SASI. When the SASI program was installed five years ago they were told of the benefits of new program. It took four years to train on SASI. Every teacher was supposed to have a PC at their desk to access information. Recently, tried to get on SASI, but could not

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as the program no longer works on MAC computers. The SASI program now works only on an IBM or Dell computer. A lot of teachers have MACs in school. Ms. Arganda wanted to know why SASI cannot be used on a MAC computer.

On motion made by Mr. Rick McClure, seconded by Mr. Gus Hawthorn, and carried, the Board adopted Resolution 03-38, appointing and employing certain professionals in connection with the development of a 2003 Series 2 Certificates of Participation to be issued under the general terms of the District's 2002 School Facility Bridge Funding Program, declaring the District's intention to reimburse expenditures from the proceeds of tax-exempt obligations to be issued or incurred by the District, and approving certain related actions. Mr. Hawthorn stated that at bottom of page five of the contract there is an important statement that construction documents show all work to be done. Contract language directly impacts change orders. If the architect fails to deliver, that company should be in fact responsible for a change order. If the contractor initiates the change, he should be legally bound to cover the cost.

Mr. D'Souza stated our attorney will try to improve and work on additional language for the contract if the firm accepts.

Dr. Ruble asked if Mr. D'Souza negotiated for a lesser cost.

Mr. D'Souza replied in the affirmative. Since awarding three projects to this architect for permanent and modular buildings, he had worked out an \$182,500.00 reduction per site. This means projects are approved faster and get ready for construction at a faster pace. Another advantage is that we can reuse plans.

Mr. McClure thought reusing plans like this is an excellent idea as hardship funding does not provide as much as other programs. He shared his concerns about modular buildings, and asked what the percentage was of modular and permanent buildings.

Mr. D'Souza advised that the classrooms are modular and the remaining buildings are permanent.

Mr. McClure stated it was a good idea but he had concerns about modular buildings and was concerned about longevity of modular versus permanent.

Mr. Cash responded that modular construction is expected to last every bit as long as permanent construction and that there was confusion between portable and modular. There are five classrooms at Almond Elementary School that blend in with the other permanent buildings.

Mr. McClure stated he did not want the District to reduce its costs now and have problems 50 years from now.

D'Souza, Associate Superintendent, Business Services to sign the necessary agreements.
